


January 19 Meeting: Asemic Writing with Lisa Leong Tsang

Asemic writing has the appearance of being a written language but has no meaning. It is an abstraction of conventional writing and is aesthetically pleasing so it can enhance a calligraphic work or be the art itself. When I practice manipulated strokes with a pointed or flat brush, not only do I find it meditative, but when I develop a rhythm to my writing, it creates forms that are beautiful to look at without being labored. This can be applied to any writing tool. The goal of this workshop is to play with strokes and pen manipulation to create our own invented letter forms.
